

THE NEED: FAMILIES IN CRISIS

Families come to the Red Door for three main reasons: to escape domestic abuse, because of a housing crisis or eviction, or because they are refugees seeking asylum.


Every family has one thing in common: without the Red Door, they would have nowhere else to go.


Our family shelter was closed briefly in early 2017 while we transitioned to a temporary location, so that construction of our new purpose-built family shelter could begin. Our VAW (Violence Against Women) shelter continued to operate as normal.

55% of the families we served in 2017-18 were women and moms with children escaping domestic violence. We served 105 of these families compared with 81 in the previous year.

We also served 45 families affected by a housing crisis and 40 refugee families. The high cost of housing and the world refugee crisis continued to create demand for shelter space.

YOUR IMPACT: EMERGENCY SHELTER

The Red Door operates two emergency shelters one for families and one exlusively for women and children escaping domestic violence.

FAMILY SHELTER

Our family shelter provides 100 shelter beds. Most residents are single moms with children, and 2 parent families as well as single dads can find shelter here. 87 families stayed here in 2017-18.

While we continue to operate out of our interim shelter located at 1430 Gerrard St. East, construction is underway at 875 Queen St. East, the site of our new purpose-built shelter, expected to be completed in Spring 2020.

VAW (Violence Against Women)

Our "Pines" shelter has 56 beds for women and moms with children fleeing domestic violence. The shelter is at a secure, undisclosed location to keep families safe from any contact with their abuser. We provided sanctuary and support for 103 families at the Pines in 2017-18.



LUCIA'S STORY

Finding sanctuary at long last

Lucia and her family came to Canada in September 2013 from a refugee camp in Kenya as sponsored refugees with the United Nations Commission for Refugees program.

Lucia and her family narrowly escaped the deadly civil war in their native Congo. As they literally ran for their lives from an armed militia, Lucia's mother-in-law, Mariam, was shot in her leg. When the family arrived at the refugee camp, there was no choice, her leg had to be amputated.

When they arrived in Toronto from the refugee camp, they did everything they could to start over in Canada, squeezing into a small apartment that they could afford, and saving all the money they could. Lucia's husband Joeseph even took a job in Alberta where he would be separated from his loved ones, but could earn enough money to support the family. In 2015, Joseph had to leave his job due to health issues and the family was no longer able to afford their rent.

Fortunately, they found support at the Red Door, where they were able to get back on their feet and connected to resources to help them settle permanently. With support from our Moving Program, Lucia's family moved into a new affordable apartment with donated furniture. They are looking forward to building their new lives together.

YOUR IMPACT: FOOD BANK

Helping families stay housed



The average family moving out of the shelter spends 54% on their monthly income on rent alone.

Your donations fund a weekly **Food Bank** that is a lifeline for families who have moved out of the shelter. It gives a worried mother peace of mind knowing that at the end of the month she won't have to choose between paying the rent and feeding her children. That kind of help is invaluable.





LOCAL PARTNERS BUILDING COMMUNITY

Local businesses like Torq indoor cycling gym are teaming up to create positive change. Throughout the year, Torq hosts evening rides where 100% of the revenue goes to Red Door. In March 2018, in partnership with Move fitness, Torq co-created 'East Love', an event that brought businesses and residential neighbours together for an evening at The Broadview Hotel, raising over \$12,000. "Torq Ride is a brand based on creating community so building awareness and raising funds for Red Door aligns with who we are and how we fit within our neighbourhood". - Julie Mitchell, founder, Torq Ride.

LOOKING TO THE FUTURE

Construction is underway at 875 Queen St. E, the home of our new purpose-built family shelter. Our new shelter will be a safe, accessible, modern sanctuary with dedicated programming space, and greater privacy for families.

We are so grateful to the many generous supporters who have donated over \$2.7M in gifts and pledges for equipment, furnishings and resident services at the new shelter.

We anticipate opening the doors to our new shelter in March 2020.

Daily personal needs allowance for families, TTC fares, personal items, other program costs.




Housing and Outreach
