At the Red Door, the holiday season is an incredible time. The shelter is a-buzz with activity, and a sense of excitement is in the air. We experience such an outpouring of generosity from the community with hundreds of supporters like you coming together to share the joy of the season with our families.

For our staff, it is truly wonderful to see the smiles on the faces of so many moms and children. For moms like Mary, the gifts mean so much more than their material value; they are truly gifts of hope.

Mary and her family arrived at the Red Door just 3 weeks before Christmas. She had fled to Canada with her two young daughters from Nigeria where she had experienced violence and abuse. "I was afraid for the life of my children, and we had no support" said Mary. When she arrived at the shelter she was clearly distraught. She was nervous about starting a new life in Canada and was very concerned about her children and not being able to provide for them on her own.

Mary had heard from her case worker that during the holidays the shelter receives many donations for the families staying there but she didn't really know what to expect because she had never celebrated Christmas. When the gifts arrived, she was overwhelmed by the generosity.

There were jackets, boots, hats and other winter attire, and even special items just for her like cosmetics and perfume. She also received gift cards for groceries and houseware stores as well some small appliances that she could use when they were ready to move into a new home.

When Mary opened the basket of toys that were given especially for her children, she started to cry. "Right now, for the first time in so long, I feel hope – like there is a weight being lifted off my shoulders". It gave her hope for her children, and she knew they would be happy even during this difficult time. "Receiving all of these gifts, I feel loved and that there are people here who care about me. I feel safe, and I can't say thank you enough".

Many more families like Mary's were thrilled with the generosity they received. So many amazing donors, groups, and workplace teams gave their support to help families at the Red Door experience a joyful holiday season.

Over 140 families were provided with wonderful gift packages, courtesy of groups like the Basketeers, Holiday Helpers, the Shoe Box Project, the Annual Basket Drive for Women, Santa Comes

to Bay Street, Project A.J., and many wonderful family sponsors.

More than 16,000 lbs of food was donated from Second Harvest and many community donors, not to mention over 180 turkeys delivered. We also collected and distributed over \$23,000 in grocery and department stores gift cards.

Through our new Holiday Helper Gift Registry, families were provided with some of the items they need to help them start a new home when they are ready to move out of the shelter.

On top of all of this, you also gave over \$181,000 in funds to help us continue running the programs that are critical in helping families rebuild their lives after experiencing homelessness and abuse.

To everyone who helped make this holiday season bright, and to all of you who have supported us through the year, thank you. What your generosity gives to mothers like Mary is beyond measure. Thank you for giving the gift of hope.


