This past year, we saw our community come together like never before providing much needed in kind and monetary donations in support of homeless families. From employee fundraising challenges to virtual gift guides, we were inspired by our community's creativity and outpouring of compassion and generosity. Here are a few special highlights!

Left Field Brewery took their Holiday Campaign digital and devised innovative ways to fundraise over \$10,000 including a Virtual Draughts & Crafts Holiday Gift Guide that featured many local artisans.

Many of these companies matched employee donations, generating thousands of dollars in donations to fund critical programming throughout the year. Other companies, like WHIRL, supported local while helping families by purchasing gift cards from local businesses and then donating them to Red Door.

Our friends at Toronto East Rotary Club continued their work to take care of families in crisis during the pandemic. They provided festive gift bags for all residents, filled with toys, games, socks, gift cards and other surprises. We are humbled by the continued support of our regular supporters and are grateful for the many new community connections and partnerships that were created.

YOUNG CHANGEMAKERS HELP FOR THE HOLIDAYS

This past holiday season saw the next generation of Red Door fundraisers in action! These young fundraisers got creative and used their time and talents to help kids just like themselves have a chance at a brighter future.

Willow started making beautiful bookmarks during COVID and raised \$350 to support our children's programs by selling her one-of-a-kind creations.

Ruby and her Grade 4 friends didn't let COVID stop them from their tradition of assembling gift bags for families, often using their own money to buy presents and including heartfelt messages of hope.

When her charity karate tournament was cancelled in April, Olivia decided to sell the practice beads she had been making. Moved by the Red Door's mission, she set out to raise over \$500 to support families needing refuge.

Since he was 4, Kailen and his mom have hosted a holiday party and collected donations for families at the Red Door. Because of COVID, they hosted two virtual paint nights, raising \$620! Said Kailen, "I've made it my mission to raise money for children and families."

Angelina and The Care Gift Elves couldn't collect items and assemble their usual wonderful care boxes this year, so instead they raised over \$1,000 to purchase gift cards for children and families.

FOOD BANK SHELVES ARE STOCKED, THANKS TO YOU!

The Red Door's Food Bank is more than just groceries; it's a lifeline of support for families once they've moved into the community. For single moms with children our Food Bank is critical to their transition into stable independence.

Last November, we experienced a shortage of non-perishable food. Our shelves were almost empty! We reached out to you and your response was overwhelming. Your outpouring of generosity helped to fill our shelves in less than a week with many extras to spare. Over \$19,000 was donated by YOU which allowed us to purchase grocery gift cards. Over the month of December, 49 families received gift cards and during the month of January, 22 families will receive additional support in this way.

Thank you for opening your hearts to support vulnerable families in need in our community! For single moms with kids, your ongoing support of our Food Bank is greatly appreciated.

KEY SUPPORT FOR FAMILIES

Our weekly Food Bank is a key support for families who moved back into the community - many who pay nearly 60% of their income on rent alone in the private rental market. Your support helps families stay housed and move forward.

URBACON BRIGHTENS UP OUR BACKYARD

Located on the street behind our women's shelter is a building that houses a childcare centre—one that cares for many of the children who come to us with their mothers, and where we run our after school and evening programs to help children establish a positive and consistent after-school routine. Connecting the shelter to the childcare building is a long interlocking pathway that had seen better days and what was once a pretty walkway, looked old and tired. The path became a safety hazard as the bricks aged.

"We really needed to fix it. It was one of those things where you need to spend a lot of money on a walkway and people ask 'why' because there doesn't appear to be a direct link to supporting the women and children in our shelter," says Wanda Lougheed, Director of Client Services at the Red Door Shelter.

That's when we were connected with Urbacon, a construction firm with offices in Montreal, Toronto and Vancouver. Urbacon supports the communities where they do business by donating time, expertise and resources, and they offered to fix our back walkway. Upon

surveying our yard and area, they also offered to fix a few of our other outdoor ailments.

"At Urbacon, all of us are committed to building better, stronger and healthier communities," says Raffaele Barone, President. "Our focus is on community wellbeing, the needs of the homeless as well as many health-related issues. We were pleased to be able to contribute to the Red Door in this way."

These weren't minor fixes. A concrete pad in the yard had settled over the years and now sloped towards the shelter. During heavy rainfalls, the water first pooled on the pad and then often seeped into our commercial kitchen and dining room. Aside from the fact that staff had to devote time to cleaning up after these floods,



And so, over the summer and early fall, the walkway was ripped up and the concrete patio was removed. The entire area was regraded and concrete was poured for a new walkway and patio. The paved area was even extended into what had been a muddy pit, a retaining wall was built to hold back rainwater and a bike rack installed.

To complete the work, heavy construction equipment needed to be brought into the backyard, which meant our gate had to be taken down. Rather than simply re-installing it upon completion, Urbacon invested in and installed a beautiful new gate to close off the yard.

Now, not only does our commercial kitchen stay dry, but the children living at the shelter have a proper place to park their bikes—and a nice, new flat pathway to safely ride along. The flagstone stairs were fixed, making them easier and safer to climb.

"The difference this has made for the shelter is really significant. This is the type of donation that doesn't at first appear to go directly to the women and children in our shelter, but it's so important to the integrity of what we do every day," says Wanda.

RENOWNED ARTIST WILL CREATE A LARGE MURAL AT OUR NEW SHEITER

The Red Door is thrilled to announce that Philip Cote has been commissioned to create a beautiful mural for our new family shelter. The mural will cover the interior walls of the outdoor/play area space.

Philip, MFA of Moose Deer Point First Nation, is a Young Spiritual Elder, Indigenous Artist, Activist, Educator, Historian and Ancestral Knowledge Keeper. He was one of two artists shortlisted from a possible five mural artists considered by a special committee for this project.

As an Indigenous artist and graduate of OCAD University's Interdisciplinary Master's in Art, Media and Design, Philip uses research to unearth, and reveal, his cultural experience and knowledge of signs of Indigenous symbols, language, and interpretation. He emphasizes the resurgent power of nature and the importance of listening to Indigenous teachings through his Mural Art.

"We believe Philip's work will educate, inspire and imbue healing energy to our clients, staff, volunteers, and supporters for years to come," says Carol Latchford, Executive Director. "We're looking forward to creating special programming opportunities for children, and adults too, to learn and understand the stories associated with Philip's mural."
